FIFTH MONTHLY MEETING TO BE HELD SEPT. 11th

Several members brought in items of general interest at our last meeting.

Ivan Hammond brought in a cluster of Jack-O-Lantern mushrooms (Clitocybe illudens) which are somewhat poisonous and have been confused by some with the chantrelle.

Jean Tippy brought in a huge polypore of some type which was so distinctive as to suggest easy identification. As it turned out, the fungus must be relatively rare; only after considerable research was the identity uncovered (see "The Mushroom Handbook" - Krieger) - Polyporus Berkeleyi.

Lise Bosman, associate member, brought in a spore print collection she has started in anticipation of a school science project

The cookout after our mushroom hunt was an enjoyable affair. Next to the hamburger on the grill were some chantrelles broiling in aluminum foil (Cantharellus cibrius). The dryed mushrooms which Ivan brought with him were broiled in butter and, as all those who tasted them can testify, they were delicious, having a pronounced sweet, nutty flavor.




