#### Mushroom Book

Dover Publications has published a reprint of a classic, Mushrooms. Edible and otherwise: Habitat and time of growth. By Miron Hard (\$ 7.95)

This is a very useful general guide to the mushrooms growing in the Midwestern and Eastern United States, with descriptions and illustrations of over 500 species. Written for amateur mushroom hunters, the author describes the habitat, time of growth, color and shape, food value and differences in appearances from similar looking mushrooms.

Also provided is information on preserving mushrooms, making spore prints, the classification of mushrooms (with analytical key)

#### STROBILOMYCES FLOCCOSUS Karst.

"The old man of the woods " or pine cone mushroom is very distinctive as this beautiful sketch by Neal Macdonald reveals. The cap is from 4 thru 15 cm broad, convex in shape with blackish scales, scales and fragments of the veil hanging from the margin.

By slicing thru a fresh specimen, you will note that the flesh is at first white, staining red and finally turning black. The underside of the cap, which has pores rather than gills, may stain like the flesh. The tubes are large, and copious amounts of black spores combine to provides interesting spore prints.

Nadya Letteney provides this method of preparing this mushroom.

"Remove the pores and scales. Cut into large chunks, and place in a sauce pan and cover with milk. Add chopped garlic, parsley, salt and pepper and simmer slowly under low heat for a half hour "

## STROBILOMYCES FLOCEOSUS



MUSHROOMS A LA GRECQUE

l Lb. Fresh Mushrooms
cup dry white wine
d cup Water
l Tbsp. Lemon Juice
3/4 cup chopped onion
l Lrge clove of garlic
minced

l tsp salt
l tsp Sugar
tsp Coriander seed
( optional )
Black pepper
cups carrot chunks
cup stuffed olives

Pat dry and halve fresh mushrooms; set aside. In a large saucepan combine oil, wine, water, lemon juice, onion, garlic, salt, sugar, coriander and black pepper. Bring to boil; add carrots. Cover and simmer 15 min. Add Mushrooms and olives Return to boil, reduce heat cover and simmer 5 min.

Chill thoroughly at least overnite. To Serve, thread mushrooms, carrot, and olives on skewers, or spoon into a bowl. Serve as hors d'oeuvre Serves eight to ten.
