We didn't even have time for a business meeting. Warmest greetings to all

those I didn't get a chance to say hello to.

Everyone totally enjoyed the basic and informative lecture and slides by Dr. Clark Rogerson who is an excellent speaker. Did you know that you should not refrigerate a mushroom before taking a spore print for identification. Also - always note the soil type or kind of tree the mushroom is on or near. Put this information on a slip of paper with the mushroom into waxed paper bags when you collect in the field. (One kind of mushroom per bag.) If you can mail your fresh specimen for identification (in the mail for no longer than two days) always wrap it in paper toweling only, including spore print and substrate information.





JUNE FORAY

Our club will hold a three day mycological weekend foray at the Pocono Environmental Education Center (PEEC) in Dingman's Ferry, Pennsylvania. Beginning on Friday, June 17 with supper and lasting to Sunday, June 19 after lunch, this trip will include workshops, lectures and demonstrations. The mycologist for the foray will be Dr. Clark Rogerson, who will be assisted by Gary Lincoff and Dr. Sam Ristich. Dr. Ristich led our very successful foray to PEEC last year.

Accommodations have been reserved for fifty (perhaps a little over) persons. If you are interested, please send in your registration fee as soon as possible.

Rates are as follows:

Registration Fee \$7.50 per person (children under five years of age - free) Registration Fee is not refundable.

Food and Lodging\$29.00 per person (1/2 price for children five yrs. old and under)

This includes a total of six meals; one on Friday, three on Saturday, and two on Sunday; -- wine and cheese party; fruit snack and money for life guard for swimming.

Ten cottages have been reserved. All the cottages have a large ceramictiled bathroom with shower and tub. Bunk beds, mattresses, pillows, chairs, lamps, dressers, curtains and housekeeping equipment are provided.

You may invite a non-member if you wish.

Registration fees will not be accepted after fifty persons have registered or after May 31, 1977, whichever occurs first.
